






## January Climate Highlight:


When Pennsylvania has experienced a prolonged period of drier than average weather (such as what began in 2006), the summer months during these dry epochs have exhibited a wide range of rainfall distributions. The following show the spread of statewide average rainfall from May to September.











Summary: June tends to be wet, July and September are typically the dry months of the summer.
