## August 2011 - Pennsylvania Weather Recap

After a period of well above normal warmth and dry conditions across the state of Pennsylvania at the end of July, the first half of August returned to more seasonable temperatures. Towards the middle of the month, these cooler temperatures combined with wetter conditions as a result of a persistent trough and multiple frontal passages over the northeastern United States, with some areas in eastern Pennsylvania seeing near-record amounts of 24 hour precipitation. Philadelphia received 4.84" of rain on the 14<sup>th</sup> resulting in the third-highest one day precipitation total for the city. Areas farther west experienced showery conditions with the majority of the rain falling in slow-moving, heavier thunderstorms.

In the second half of the month, temperatures remained near, or slightly below seasonal as a few minor frontal boundaries crossed the area, resulting in some scattered strong to severe thunderstorms across the Commonwealth. The main highlight of this time period was the extremely heavy rainfall which fell across the eastern portion of the state associated with Hurricane Irene. The storm progressed northward along the east coast of the US from August 26<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup>. Only 13 days after setting the third highest one day precipitation total record, Philadelphia received 4.55" of rain on August 27<sup>th</sup>, the 9<sup>th</sup> highest total at the airport location. Wilkes-Barre/Scranton received 3.23" on August 28<sup>th</sup>, tying the 10<sup>th</sup> highest total at that location. In addition, Philadelphia broke their one-month precipitation total record by over 6" with a total of 19.31".

Here are the weather extremes across Pennsylvania (observations taken at 8AM EDT) during August 2011 from the NWS Cooperative & ASOS Networks of which our office receives routine observations. The extremes occurred in the 24-hour period prior to the date listed.
